How to Adore the Eucharistic Jesus

(St Manuel González García)

“Jesus in our Tabernacles is not simply present in the way that a statue would be present, but rather He is present as a real and living Person.

If Jesus is present in the Tabernacle with His eyes looking at me, then when I am before Him, I should be looking at the Sacred Host with my physical eyes as well as with the eyes of my soul - looking into the interior of that Host.

If Jesus is present in the Tabernacle with His ears ever ready to listen to me, then I should go before the Tabernacle listening to Him with all my attention, and with much interest to talk to Him.

If Jesus is present in the Tabernacle with His hands full of gifts for the needy who come to ask for those gifts, I should go before Him with my poverty fully exposed with great trust.

In other words, if Jesus is present in the Tabernacle to prolong, extend and perpetuate His Incarnation and Redemption, the least I should do is to present to Him my whole soul with all its powers, and my whole body with all its senses, so that they may receive and be filled with the feelings, ideas, and affections of Jesus, our Incarnate Redeemer.”

May the Heart of Jesus in the most Blessed Sacrament be praised, adored, and loved with grateful affection at every moment in all the tabernacles of the world, now and until the end of time. Amen.
